‘BEWILDERED NO LONGER’

We’re on our way! The Walsingham Pilgrim Hymn, which we will sing in procession on Monday night, tells the story of the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham. We will sing of its highs and lows, recounting how the Lady Richeldis received a vision from Our Lady to build a replica of the Holy House so that Walsingham would become England’s Nazareth—mindful, of course, that, this year, we celebrate the centenary of the restoration of the Shrine by Fr Alfred Hope Paten, after years of destruction and desolation:

*Bewildered she pondered this message so sweet,
When a clear spring of water burst forth at her feet.*

*Bewildered no longer for this was the sign,
She vowed on this spot she would build such a shrine.”*

We are bewildered by many things. Many of us have emerged from the last two years of Lockdown with a sense of bewilderment. Perhaps we will not realise the full consequences of such an experience for some time to come.

There is also so much more that leaves us bewildered. We are bewildered by the experiences of the world, whether at home or abroad. The fragility of peace, the threat of war, the environmental crisis, the plight of refugees, the cost of living, the reality of child poverty in our communities, the growth in foodbanks, the changes in the church, the challenges we face day by day, the cost of love.

We are bewildered by our own personal circumstances, whether it’s the experience of illness, the challenges of growing old, concerns about a loved one, the difficulties faced by the young, financial burdens, the fragility of life, the ‘just not knowing’ what God wants or expects of us.

During this pilgrimage, we will experience so many things, and each of us will bring with us a sense of bewilderment. Together, we will experience so much joy but also be alongside one another through the difficulties and challenges of our journey through life. We never make pilgrimage alone. We share in the journey with so many travelling companions.

“We are only the earthenware jars that hold this treasure, to make it clear that such an overwhelming power comes from God and not from us,” writes St Paul in his letter to the Corinthians which we will hear on Monday during the Mass for St James. Yes, we may feel like cracked pots, fragile and vulnerable but, at St Paul continues, *“We are in difficulties on all sides, but never cornered; we see no answer to our problems, but never despair; we have been persecuted, but never deserted; knocked down, but never killed; always, wherever we may be, we carry with us in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus, too, may always be seen in our body.”*

So, here’s to a good journey, a holy pilgrimage. Bewildered no longer, may we experience within the cracked pots of our lives, a treasure worth beholding. **Bon Voyage!**

DAILY NOTES

General

All you need to participate in the liturgical celebrations of this week is found within these pages. However, you may like to buy a Walsingham Pilgrim Manual from the Shrine Shop which will provide more insight into the life and spirituality of the shrine as well as helping you to discover more about the Shrine's Pilgrimage Theme during 2022. The Manual costs £2.00 and will also be useful for your own personal devotions and point you to other ways in which you can share in the life of the shrine when you are away from it!

As well as our own pilgrimage programme, which is set out on page 4, there is also the usual daily round of prayer within the shrine: 7.45 a.m. Angelus and Morning Prayer (All Souls' Chapel); Evening Prayer at 5.30 p.m and Shrine Prayers (Angelus and Rosary) at 6.00 pm. You are more than welcome to participate in these—they form the rhythm of the Shrine's life week by week throughout the year.

The Reception Office on the ground floor of the Milner Wing near the archway is open daily from 9.00 am—7.00 pm for general enquiries or any problems during your stay. The night porters are available during the evening and night. Use the internal phones and dial 220 or 315 in the event of an emergency.

In the event of the fire alarm sounding (continuous ringing bell) please leave the building. DO NOT assume it's a test! There are fire notices on the back of each bedroom door, take a moment to read and familiarise yourself with the escape route and assembly point. Please do not use the lift if the fire alarm sounds.

Accommodation: On the journey each pilgrim will be given a badge indicating where they are staying. Please wear these badges as they are used as a means of identification at meal times. If you are travelling by car these will be available on arrival.

Keys and fobs: The shrine issues keys for room doors. Along with the key will be a fob giving you access to the main door of the building in which you are staying. You will find the keys in the doors of the room on arrival but you will need to keep them with you thereafter to access buildings. On the key will be a black fob that will grant you access into your accommodation building. Next to the front door, you will see a black box on the wall. To gain entrance place your key in front of the box, you will hear a beep and the door will release. To exit the building, press the black button on the inside of the door that says 'Press to exit'. The Brandie Gate, the main entrance to the Shrine Grounds, will close at midnight and unlocked at 6am. However, if you're staying in Mileham or St Annes, the main doors are accessed by keypads (the number is on your badge!) The 'College' rooms have keys but no fobs. If you need any assistance with keys please speak to the staff at the Accommodation Office who are always happy to help.

Internet Access: To access the internet you will need to search and find ‘The Anglican Shrine’ network and the password is olw-wifi.

The Norton Café Bar will be open for your use from 10am daily until 11pm. Please do not hesitate to contact reception should you need any help.

Special Diets: If you have ordered a special diet, you will be issued with a ticket which you must show at the Refectory food servery at meal times. Please return them at the last meal.

Silence: Pilgrims are reminded of the need for silence in the shrine church and in the fountain courtyard immediately outside.

Consideration for Others: Between the hours of 11.00 pm and 7.00 am please be as quiet as possible in the corridors. Close doors quietly behind you. If you’re back late remember those who go to bed early, or if you’re up early remember those who got back late!

No Smoking: Smoking is not permitted in any of the buildings. You are welcome to smoke within the shrine gardens, but please dispose of the cigarette ends in the bins provided.

Refreshments: There are Tea and Coffee Making facilities in all accommodation buildings. Please make yourself at home!

Monday

Arrival: On arrival the coaches will stop outside the Shrine Church. You *may* be asked to remain on the coach whilst a member of the Hospitality Team welcomes you. People will be on hand to guide you to your accommodation. Please do be aware of individuals who may need some help with their luggage—and perhaps offer them a helping hand! For those travelling by car, please note that parking permits are no longer available at Reception. There is a parking meter in the car park which accepts notes, coins and cards.

Servers: There will be a meeting for all Servers in the Shrine Sacristy at 4.30 p.m.

Mass: The Monday Evening Mass of St James will be offered for the repose of the soul of Graham Francis, priest

Tuesday

Stations of the Cross: these take place at various times from 9.00 am onwards. Please gather in the shrine church and join the next group. They usually ‘set off’ at about 10 or 15 minute intervals or until a significant group is formed. There are also Stations of the Cross arranged for those whose mobility is limited, which begin at 9.30 am (gather behind the outdoor altar). Stations of the Cross in Welsh take place at 9.45 am in the Shrine Church.

The Chapel of Reconciliation/Slipper Chapel (RC Shrine): Coaches will leave from outside the Shrine Church at 2.00pm. for those unable to walk to the Slipper Chapel. They will return after Benediction. The walk to the RC Shrine is approximately 1 mile.

Liturgy of Healing: During this liturgy we will have the opportunity to receive water from the holy well, and celebrate the ministries of healing: Laying on of Hands, Anointing with Oil and the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession). More information about the ministries will be given during the liturgy.

Welsh Mass: At some point through the week, an additional Said Mass will be celebrated in the medium of Welsh. This will be announced during the notices.

Wednesday

Intercessions in the Holy House: offered in groups (usually parish groups) from 9.00am onwards. If you are not part of a parish group then please do join any group—they'll be more than happy for you to join them! Give your completed Intercession sheets to the leader of that group. Please make arrangements concerning the time you will be meeting, but remember that Mass this morning is at 11.30 am in the Parish Church

Mass: The Mass today is in the Parish Church. If you are able to offer a lift to anyone who may have difficulty walking to and from the church, please can you tell Fr Dean so that we can liaise with those in need of some assistance? Thank you.

Free Afternoon: Wednesday afternoon is free for you to spend time in the shrine and the village at your leisure. There is often a coach trip arranged and details of this will be given on Tuesday and Wednesday. We are open to suggestions about the destination.

Enter the Mystery You are invited to a Drinks Reception in the Orangery from 5.45 pm. Come and enjoy a free drink with an opportunity to learn more about a new missional community in the catholic tradition, of which this pilgrimage is a part.

Thursday

Luggage: Before Mass, please bring your luggage to the coaches parked outside the Shrine. Please **clearly** label which coach and which drop off point your luggage is intended, and place your luggage with others on the same coach.

Keys: Please remember to return the door keys to Reception!

Blessings: place any devotional articles or books you would like blessed on S. George's altar by 9.00 a.m.

Offerings: If you would like to make an offering towards the work of the Shrine then please place it on the altar of the Holy House before Mass today. If you pay tax please use a Gift Aid envelope.

TUESDAY (from 9.00 am onwards)

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

We begin in the nave of the Shrine Church.

+ In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

May God our strength and salvation, be with you all.

And also with you.

The priest introduces the Stations of the Cross and leads us in prayer. At the end of the prayer, all say: **Amen.**

On the way to each station a verse of the following hymn is sung:

Stations 1 and 8

At the cross her station keeping,
stood the mournful mother weeping,
close to Jesus at the last
Through her soul, of joy bereaved,
bowed with anguish, deeply grieved,
now at length the sword hath passed.

Stations 2 and 9

O, that blessed one, grief-laden,
blessed Mother, blessed Maiden,
Mother of the all-holy One;
O that silent, ceaseless mourning,
O those dim eyes, never turning
from that wondrous, suffering Son.

Stations 3 and 10

Who, on Christ's dear mother gazing,
in her trouble so amazing,
born of woman, would not weep?
Who on Christ's dear Mother thinking,
such a cup of sorrow drinking,
would not share her sorrows deep?

Stations 4 and 11

For his people's sins, in anguish,
there she saw the victim languish,
bleed in torments, bleed and die.
Saw the Lord's anointed taken,
saw her Child in death forsaken,
heard his last expiring cry.

Station 5 and 12:

In the passion of my Maker,
be my sinful soul partaker,
may I bear with her my part;
Of his passion bear the token,
in a spirit bowed and broken
bear his death within my heart.

Stations 6 and 13:

May his wounds both wound and heal me
he enkindle, cleanse, anneal me,
be his cross my hope and stay.
May he, when the mountains quiver,
from that flame which burns for ever
shield me on the judgment day.

Stations 7 and 14

Jesus, may thy cross defend me,

All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.
